English Baccalaureate: EBacc

Is a measure that recognises where students have secured a grade 4 or above across a core of academic subjects – English, mathematics, history or geography, two sciences and a modern foreign language.

This is highly promoted nationally as a 'gold standard' of achievement and will influence university entrance for many universities.

and is now reading English literature at Cambridge University.




Kalu studied maths at Brentside
